Executive Summary

The 2021 administration of the NODA Databank highlights several ongoing challenges as a result of the COVID -19 global pandemic.

Budget Challenges

On average, departm ent operating budgets decreased by about 20% after March 2020, with the most impacted departments being those with an operating budget over \$250,000 per year. In total, half of institutions indicated their department's budget decreased after March 2020, in nearly a third that decreased at least 25%. Many institutions implemented measures such as furloughs and pay reductions as a result.

Staffing Changes

Full-time professional and graduate student staffing remained fairly consistent over the past year; however, institutions noted it was not easy to fill vacant positions due to h iring freeze s.

Programming Changes

Compared to before March 2020, institutions saw a decrease of in-person orientation, transition, and retention programming and a sharp in crease in fully online delivery. Protocols most widely implemented during th e pandemic include multiple safely measures , hybrid, and virtual programming.

Resources and Professional Development

Institutions indicated that webinars, NODAfications, NODA Review, and Region Meeting/Chat/Slack as their top choices for ways to get resources from NODA. For professional development, institutions indicated a preference for larger live events like conferences, webinars, and institutes.

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About the Databank

The NODA Databank is a benchmarking survey sent every three years to NODA member institutions to better understand the programs, offices, and services provided by different institutions.



Data Collection

The 2021 Databank was administered in late spring 2021, with 83 member institutions responding to the survey between April 29 and June 17.



Survey Instrument

The 2021 Databank contained a total of 37 survey questions.



Report Findings

This report contains descriptive analysis only. While related questions are compared in single charts, findings do not indicate whether differences between groups are statistically-significant.

Introd uction

NODA has conducted benchmarking surveys of Orientation, Transition, and Retention (OTR) professionals for more than two decades, with a new survey sent out approximately every three to five years. This report presents findings from the 2021 NODA Dat abank Survey (Databank), which follows the 2017 report. The Databank is an essential resource for NODA members that benchmar ks the services, programs, and operations of orientation, transition and retention programs.

Survey Instrument

The survey instrumen t for the 2021 Databank was shortened significantly from the instrument due to ongoing COVID -19 pandemic. Several typically used for a Databank administration additional questions were added to provide context around how the profession has changed during the pandemic and to address ongoing challenges.

The 2021 Databank survey included a total of 37 questions (9 categorical, 6 numeric response, 13 multi -response, 2 percent allocation, and 7 text response). Questions primarily related to five categori es: departmental characteristics, budgets, staffing, programming, assessment, and professional development. Most of these categories included questions asking about the effects of COVID-19.

Administration

The 2021 Databank was launched on April 29, 2021 a nd closed on June 17, 2021. NODA invited institutions to participate via an open link sent via email using NODA's list of primary contacts from member institutions.

Participants

One member per institution, who is in a leadership position, was invited to pa rticipate in the survey but the survey could be filled out jointly, recognizing that different professionals may have access to different kinds of OTR data

In total, 78 institutions fully completed the survey . When including partial responses, the total number of participating institutions was 83.
